**Evaluation Methods Used:** A combination of manual and guided automatic testing is performed on an extensive set of screens/pages using AMP (Accessibility Management Platform). Evaluation with OS accessibility features including high contrast mode and the sticky keys feature as well as use with only the keyboard is performed throughout the Application. Additionally, testing with assistive technology including the Windows Narrator screen reader is performed alongside evaluation with inspection tools to ensure that all content is available through an accessibility API and operable to users of assistive technology.
